- Reading at the tree.
- Carving their names on the tree; 'Amir and Hassan, the sultans of Kabul'.
- Amir striking and throwing pomegranates at Hassan who is standing at the tree.
- Amir returning to the tree much later.

#### **Tree significance:**

• Ideas and words such as 'free, safe haven, friendship, learning, sharing, turmoil, redemption, forgiveness, frustration, guilt, fear'. (5)
